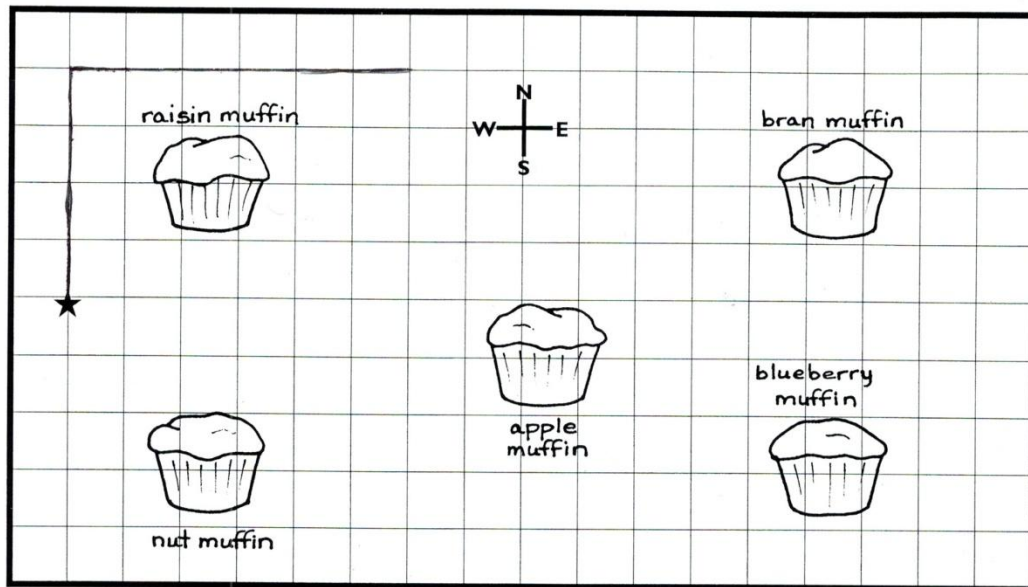

Rosa Parks

Equal Rights

Rosa Parks became known as the Mother of the Civil Rights Movement.

For much of Rosa Parks's life, African Americans did not have the same rights as white people. For instance, Rosa went to a school just for African American children. There was a different school for white children.

Also at that time, African Americans could not sit with white people on the bus. They had to sit in the back. After work one day, an adult Rosa sat in the middle of the bus. When a white man wanted her seat, she would not move. Rosa was sent to jail.

After that, many African Americans stopped riding the bus. They thought what happened to Rosa was unfair. In 1956, a law was changed. African Americans could sit anywhere they chose on a bus. Rosa had helped make things better for African Americans. People began to call her the Mother of the Civil Rights Movement.
